The Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary established the school in 1906 at the corner of Franklin and Western Avenues in the Los Feliz foothills of Los Angeles. Today, more than a century later, Immaculate Heart remains committed to the intellectual vitality, spiritual growth, moral strength, and social-emotional development of its students.

Immaculate Heart fosters academic excellence and creativity in an environment that empowers students to become women of great heart and right conscience. Reflecting its Catholic identity, the school affirms the dignity of each student and, in doing so, has shaped more than 10,000 graduates.




Our Campus

Immaculate Heart's tranquil garden setting in a thriving urban area is conducive to study and enjoyment. Pathways lined with flowering shrubbery lead to the chapel and inspire student reflection. A grassy quad and a cobblestone patio draw students together at lunch and breaks.

The Middle School is dedicated to the intellectual, spiritual, moral and social development of young women in grades six, seven and eight. In partnership with parents, the school encourages students to become women with a deep concern for things of the mind and the heart through leadership, service and Catholic Christian values.

Students receive a strong academic foundation, enabling a successful transition into the college preparatory high school with enthusiasm and confidence. Faculty members specialize in young adolescent education, and a low student-to-teacher ratio ensures students receive the individual attention needed at this pivotal time in their lives.

Middle School

Students are challenged in an educational environment that is specifically designed for young girls of middle school age. The comprehensive core curriculum includes academics, the arts, health and physical education. Dedicated administrators and faculty oversee the progress of each student to facilitate academic and personal growth. Instruction is differentiated to meet the needs of each individual and all classes are designed to develop the critical thinking skills necessary to excel in a college-preparatory high school.



STUDENT LIFE

Life outside the classroom is filled with events, activities, assemblies, field trips and celebrations. All are designed to encourage students to identify and to pursue their individual gifts and talents, to sharpen their critical thinking skills, and to broaden their perspective on the world around them.


VISUAL & PERFORMING ARTS



